The Census Bureau measures more than people

Most people know that the U.S. Census Bureau measures the population every 10 years.



- But most people don't know that we also measure the economy.
 - In fact, the Census Bureau conducts more than 50 economic surveys each year.
- This includes the **Economic Census** which measures U.S. businesses every 5 years.







Census Economic Surveys


- Monthly and Quarterly Surveys include the nation's key economic indicators, essential for tracking and reporting the GDP
 - Retail and Wholesale Trade
 - **Building Permits**
 - Imports and Exports
- Annual Surveys and Programs provide data for nearly every sector of the economy
 - County Business Patterns
 - Annual Business Survey
 - Nonemployer Statistics
 - Statistics of U.S. Businesses



Census Economic Programs

Census Bureau economic programs are a key source for official statistics:


- **NEW** High Frequency data
- Monthly and quarterly small sample surveys provide the most TIMELY data available
- Annual surveys have larger samples and provide the most up-to-date **TREND** data available
- Every 5 years, the Censuses measure all businesses and governments and provide the most **COMPREHENSIVE** data available
- Plus, **FOUNDATIONAL** administrative data from the Business Register to supplement or produce additional economic products





Annual Integrated Economic Survey (AIES)

Streamlined design that integrates and replaces seven existing annual business surveys into ONE single survey.

What is a small business?

Examples include:

- Employment size = 500 or fewer employees
- Average annual receipts

Receipts are relative to the industry.

 - Employment size class






Number of Women's Clothing Establishments in Albany County, NY: 2012 - 2021



ABS Content

- Data available on
 - Number of employer firms
 - Sales, value of shipments, or revenue
 - Number of employees
 - Annual payroll
- Firm data include
 - Economic and Demographic characteristics
 - Business characteristics of businesses and business owners by sex, ethnicity, race, and veteran status
 - Content incorporates a new set of questions for each survey year












Economic Census

The official five-year measure of American businesses





Economic Census Data

- The Economic Census provides the most comprehensive data available. It is the only official source of statistics down to the local level.
 - First data release is planned for early 2024.
- Responses from each company are aggregated to create official statistics for all U.S. industries and geographies.
 - Information from individual businesses can never shared -Census is required by law to protect confidentiality.
- The Economic Census also sets the statistical benchmark for all other economic surveys – making analysis for annual, quarterly and monthly surveys possible.
- Results from all Census economic surveys are free and available online for companies to use for business planning.





2022 Economic Census Data

- •NAICS: Nearly every 2- thru 6-digit code covered by the Census Bureau
- •Geography: National, state, metro and other lower geographies (areas shown vary by sector)
- •Other Dimensions: Data by business size (establishment and firm; employment and revenue), Legal Form of Organization, Franchise status, etc.
- •Over 200 data variables shown, including number of establishments, employment, payroll and "sales" plus sector-specific variables (inventories, assets, expenses, etc.)



What's New for 2022

- New questions reflecting the changing economy (so as data users, you'll be able to get more information on different industries such as...)
- Geographic areas updates
- Inclusion of selected Agricultural industry subsectors (1151 & 1152)
- Data release and publication changes
 - Data is available sooner than past collections
 - Geographic Area Statistics single release
