Pursuant to Section 61-1.5(f) of Title 12 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a hearing pursuant to Section 61-1.5 (f) and Part 701 of Title 12 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations (12 NYCRR Section 61-1.5 [f] and Part 701) will be held via WebEx or similar videoconferencing software application used by the New York State Department of Labor (the "Department"), on <u>July 22, 2024, at 9:30 a.m.</u>, and on such later dates as may be necessary until the matter is fully heard, before the Crane Operators Examining Board of the State of New York (the "Examining Board") concerning the possible suspension, revocation, or restriction of your Crane Operator Certificate of Competence No 19-0038 ("Certificate No 19-0038").

The Examining Board will determine whether your Certificate No 19-0038 should be suspended, revoked, or restricted. The Examining Board will determine whether you violated a regulation or law, whether you failed to comply with an order of the Commissioner of Labor, whether you are a person of proper competence, judgment, or ability with respect to the operation of a crane, or whether there is other good cause to suspend, revoke, or restrict Certificate No 19-0038.

In particular, the Examining Board will review your involvement and conduct in an incident that occurred on May 13, 2022, at or near 2661 West Lake Road, Penn Yan, NY 14527 in which a crane that you operated (a hydraulic boom LinkBelt HTC 8690 with 90 ton capacity

and 141ft boom) was involved in the fatality of Ryan Rector. This review will include, but not be limited to, your failure to report such incident/fatality as an unusual incident as required by 12 NYCRR § 61-3.7. Such failure to report resulted in the issuance of a Notice of Violation and Order to Comply, dated October 13, 2023, by the Department's Industry Inspection Bureau (a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A").

### TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that:

- (a) You are requested to appear and will be afforded full opportunity to present relevant oral and documentary evidence and to examine and cross-examine witnesses;
- (b) You are entitled to be represented by counsel;
- (c) You are required to produce at the hearing all records, documents, reports and papers in your possession relating to this matter; and
- (d) Based upon the record made in this hearing, the Crane Examining Board will submit its report and recommendations to the Commissioner of Labor who will determine what action, if any, should be taken regarding Certificate No 19-0038.

FURTHER NOTICE IS GIVEN that Tracy Semeiks of the Department, is hereby designated as the Hearing Officer, in place of the Commissioner of Labor to conduct this hearing, with all powers vested in the Commissioner of Labor for that purpose.

All parties are entitled to be represented by counsel and will be afforded full opportunity to offer testimony and evidence, examine and cross-examine witnesses and submit proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that if you, as a party to this proceeding, or a witness you plan to produce, will need the services of a translator or an interpreter for a deaf person, you must notify the Hearing Officer NO LATER THAN fourteen (14) days prior to the hearing date

to make accommodations for these services. Failure to do so may result in the exclusion of testimony through these means during the course of the hearing.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the hearing shall be conducted in accordance with Article 3 of the New York State Administrative Procedure Act and the New York State Department of Labor Adjudication Plan as established by 12 NYCRR 701 et. Seq.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that this hearing shall be conducted via video conferencing by WebEx or similar videoconferencing software applications designated by the Administrative Adjudication Office. All parties will appear remotely for the hearing through the prescribed videoconferencing system using their home or business computers and internet access. The Administrative Adjudication Office will specify the exact videoconferencing service to be used, provide an e-mail to the parties with the link to access that service and instructions on how to join the hearing through this service. Any party that does not have access to a computer for the videoconference and wishes to appear physically at a Department of Labor location shall contact the Hearing Officer at his or her earliest convenience, but no less than <u>fourteen</u> (14) days prior to the hearing.

Within fourteen (14) days of the date of this Notice all parties must provide an email address, which will be used to provide access to the software application for the hearing, to the Administrative Adjudication Office at: <a href="mailto:adminadjud@labor.ny.gov">adminadjud@labor.ny.gov</a>. Any e-mails sent to the Administrative Adjudication Office <a href="mailto:must">must</a> reference the Respondent(s) set forth in the Notice of Hearing in the subject line.

All parties must mail or deliver physical copies of any possible evidentiary materials to the Administrative Adjudication Office and all other parties, no later than three (3) days prior to the hearing. The parties shall provide the material in an organized fashion, appropriately marked as exhibits. Department and Respondent proposed exhibits will be identified as such and numbered, beginning with number "1." At least three (3) days prior to the hearing, a party may request the Hearing Officer, or the other party, to accept electronic copies of proposed exhibits.

If agreed to by the other parties and permitted by the Hearing Officer, electronic documents must be in portable document file ("pdf") format. Failure to provide proposed exhibits in an organized fashion and in the format required, may result, upon application by one of the parties, or at the Hearing Officer's discretion, in the Hearing Officer excluding the information, or some portion thereof from the record, or another remedy chosen by the Hearing Officer.

All communications, additional requests, pleadings or evidentiary materials a party wishes to provide to the Hearing Officer should also be sent to the Administrative Adjudication Office at: <a href="mailto:adminadjud@labor.ny.gov">adminadjud@labor.ny.gov</a>, as well as to the other parties.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that RESPONDENT is required to file an ANSWER in writing at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of this hearing. Said ANSWER shall contain a specific admission, denial or explanation of each of the material facts alleged in the Notice. Such a denial may be upon information and belief or a denial of knowledge or information sufficient to form a belief as to the allegation. The ANSWER must also contain a statement of any facts upon which Respondent relies for an affirmative defense. Said ANSWER shall be personally delivered or served by certified mail, return receipt requested, upon the Administrative Adjudication Office and the Department of Labor attorney assigned to this case as set forth below, and via e-mail to the Administrative Adjudication Office at: <a href="mailto:adminadjud@labor.ny.gov">adminadjud@labor.ny.gov</a> and the e-mail address designated by the Department of Labor attorney.

At the Hearing Officer's discretion, upon receipt of Respondent's Answer, or written notice

of appearance, the Hearing Officer may conduct a telephone conference with all parties who

have appeared in the proceeding, at which time the Hearing Officer will discuss the possibility of

settling the matter prior to hearing, videoconferencing rules, the evidentiary requirements, and

other relevant issues.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE THAT if you fail to appear at the hearing in this matter, such

failure will result in a default and a waiver of your right to a hearing; and an Order will be issued

against you granting the relief requested in this Notice of Hearing and Designation of Hearing

Officer.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE THAT the Hearing Officer may, upon application by any of

the parties hereto, or at the Hearing Officer's discretion, depending upon the rules governing

meetings set in place by the Governor or the Department of Labor, convert this VIDEO ONLY

HEARING, to a hearing where the hearing officer may be physically present with the parties, or

direct some parties to appear by video, or some other form of attendance.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that, pursuant to 12 NYCRR 701.10, any request for an



## **Guidance for Crane Practices in Arboriculture**<sup>1</sup>



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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Tree Care Industry Association, in collaboration with the Maine Arborist Association and in consultation with representatives from federal OSHA Region 1, recommend this as a documented protocol or decision-making process for arborists to follow, each and every time a crane is required to hoist a climber.

### Introduction

The purpose of this document, first and foremost, is to assist employers with assuring that their tree care operations using cranes have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure a safe operation. Secondarily, it is intended to provide guidance to the employer to avoid potential OSHA citation.

OSHA doesn't have a problem generally with the use of cranes in arboricultural work so long as OSHA-compliant procedures are followed. These procedures are summarized and explained in ANSI Z133.1 (see page 8 of this document). Crane operators should also be familiar with OSHA's general industry crane standard, 29 CFR §1910.180, which can be accessed electronically on the federal OSHA web site.

OSHA's issue with cranes in arboriculture focuses pretty narrowly on the practice of hoisting a climber into a work position with the crane. This practice violates an OSHA standard, even though it may provide the safest or only feasible means to access a tree's canopy, as it does in the illustration to the right. The burden of proof is on the arborist to establish that complying with OSHA's standard is either *impossible* (infeasible) or *less safe* for workers.

The so-called "employer affirmative defense" is explained in this excerpt from OSHA Directive number CPL 02-01-045, *OSHA Citation Guidance Related to Tree Care and Tree Removal Operations*, effective 8/21/2008:



Among other requirements, the [OSHA Crane] standard prohibits hoisting an individual on the crane load or hook (§1910.180(h)(3)(v)). This requirement applies even though the American National Standard for

Arboricultural Operations, ANSI Z133.1-2006, §5.7.9, allows the hoisting of personnel into position with a crane. An employer's reliance on the ANSI [Standard] is therefore not a defense to a violation of §1910.180(h)(3)(v). An employer may, however, assert that compliance with the OSHA standard is either impossible/infeasible or presents a greater hazard to the employee. As with other affirmative defenses, the employer bears the burden of proving these affirmative defenses.

1. In accordance with OSHA Instruction CPL 02-00-103, *Field Inspection Reference Manual (FIRM)*, Chapter III, **impossibility/infeasibility** is established when compliance is:

- a. Functionally impossible or would prevent performance of the required work; and
- b. There are no alternative means of employee protection.
- 2. A **greater hazard** defense exists when compliance with the standard:
  - a. Results in greater hazards to the employee than noncompliance;
  - b. There are no alternative means of employee protection; and
  - c. An application of a variance would be inappropriate [see page 12].

- 3. If there is reason to believe that either defense may be asserted by an employer using a crane to position an employee, CSHOs [compliance officers] shall consider whether the following (non-exclusive) alternative methods could have been used:
  - a. Can an aerial lift position employees? Aerial lifts (e.g., bucket trucks or cherry-pickers) are available in many configurations, some with booms of up to 46 meters. Aerial lifts with material handlers are also available, though generally not with the longest booms. Cranes may be used in addition to aerial lifts if heavy limbs must be handled. Aerial devices used in compliance with 29 CFR 1910.67 *Vehicle-mounted elevating and rotating work platforms* are considered a safe method of positioning employees.
  - b. Is the tree safe to climb? Climbing decayed or damaged trees could be hazardous. For instance, damage to tree bark from insect infestation, or missing tree bark caused by fire, may make climbing infeasible or more hazardous than using a crane.<sup>2</sup> If the tree is not damaged or decayed to the extent that climbing would be unsafe, then climbing is normally considered safe using the appropriate climbing equipment and practices.
  - c. If it is impossible to use an aerial device and if climbing is unsafe, can a personnel platform be suspended from a crane? Personnel platforms meeting §1926.550(g)(2) are available in several designs and, when used, will be treated as *de minimis*<sup>3</sup> violations of §1910.180(h)(3)(v). These platforms are required to be designed to minimize tipping caused by personnel movement through the use of an appropriate suspension system.

•••••

To the arborist considering the use of a crane to hoist a climber, we recommend this four- step decision-making process:

- 1. Document the hazards of the tree/site that require the use of the crane and that specifically require its use to hoist the climber. Diagramming the site may be useful in communicating this information to others.
- 2. Using the checklist provided, document why other methods of tree access are infeasible or less safe than being hoisted by the crane.
- 3. Make sure every aspect of the crane operation conforms to accepted regulations and standards. An excerpt from ANSI Z133.1-2012 is provided for your convenience.
- 4. Make sure that all members of the crane crew have the appropriate licenses, certifications and competencies to perform their assigned duties. A checklist of recommended skills/knowledge is again provided for your convenience.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Another common scenario for crane hoisting that OSHA neglected to mention in its directive is in storm response to wind-thrown trees where timing of response is critical and the tree is inherently and obviously unsafe to climb.


<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> *De minimis* conditions are those where an employer has implemented a measure different than one specified in a standard, that has no direct or immediate relationship to safety or health. Whenever *de minimis* conditions are found during an inspection, they are documented in the same manner as other violations, but no penalty is levied.

KEY: terms in **bold print** in the body of the text are defined in ANSI Z133's *Glossary*.

#### 5.7 Cranes and Knucklebooms

- **5.7.1** The items contained in section 5.1 shall always be included in the review of this section.
- **5.7.2** Cranes shall be inspected in accordance with ASME B30.5 or ASME B30.22 (articulating boom) standards and manufacturers' guidelines. Rigging equipment shall be inspected before each use in accordance with OSHA 1910.184 and manufacturers' guidelines.
- **5.7.3** Operators of hoisting equipment shall be trained and shall maintain a 10-foot minimum approach distance from unguarded, overhead energized conductors, or greater separation in accordance with Table 2. A spotter shall be used when work is being performed that could encroach upon minimum approach distances from energized conductors. The spotter shall be positioned to effectively gauge the clearance distance and give timely information to the **qualified crane operator**.
- **5.7.4** Only a qualified crane operator shall be used.
- **5.7.5** Cranes shall be equipped to comply with the design standards published in ASME B30.5 or ASME-B30.22 (for articulating booms).
- **5.7.6** Hooks on overhaul ball assemblies, lower load blocks, or other attachment assemblies shall be of a type that can be closed and locked, eliminating the hook throat opening.
- **5.7.7** Crane operators shall remain at the controls while a load is **suspended.**
- **5.7.8** Tree sections shall be rigged to minimize load shifting. Controlled load lowering shall be used. **Shock-loading** shall be avoided, and free fall is prohibited.
- **5.7.9** The qualified arborist shall estimate the weight of the tree section to be suspended prior to cutting the section. The load weight estimate shall be communicated to the crane operator. After the pick is complete, the crane operator should verify, compare, and communicate the estimated weight to the qualified arborist. A green log weight chart (such as Annex E) shall be available to the crew. The suspended load should not exceed 80 percent of the load chart capacity of the crane.
- **5.7.10** The qualified crane operator and the crew leader shall meet prior to the work to review procedures to be followed. If the work involves a designated **signal person** and/or an additional qualified arborist being hoisted by the crane, these persons shall participate in the review as well. A job briefing shall be done before any work begins in accordance with subsection 3.1.4.
- **5.7.11** Cranes shall be set up in accordance with manufacturers' specifications.
- **5.7.12** Radio communication between the qualified arborist and qualified crane operator should be used during **blind picks**. Radio communication should be hands-free.
- **5.7.13** A qualified arborist may be hoisted into position utilizing a crane if the arborist he/she is tied in with an **arborist climbing line** and **arborist saddle** and secured to an anchor point on or above the crane hook or to the crane boom<sup>5</sup>. The following procedures shall be followed when a qualified arborist is to be hoisted by a crane:

- **5.7. 13.1** A qualified person shall only authorize the use of a crane for hoisting a qualified arborist into position when he/she has determined that it is the safest and/or only feasible method to perform the work or gain access to a tree.
- **5.7. 13.2** The arborist climbing line shall be secured to the crane in such a way that it does not interfere with the function of any of the crane's components. No part of the crane shall be allowed to compromise the climbing line or any component of the climbing system. The qualified arborist shall use a second point of attachment on or above the crane hook or to the crane boom while being hoisted into position in the tree.
- **5.7. 13.3** Constant communication between the crane operator and the qualified arborist being hoisted shall be maintained, either directly or through a designated signal person, using two-way radio, vocal communication or accepted hand signals (Annex G).
- **5.7. 13.4** The qualified crane operator shall remain at the controls while the qualified arborist is attached to the crane.
- **5.7. 13.5** When the qualified arborist is being hoisted, hoisting speed shall not exceed 100 feet/minute (0.5 m/sec). During hoisting operations, there shall be no sudden acceleration or deceleration of the moving load.
- **5.7. 13.6** The load-line hoist drum shall have a system or other device on the power train, other than the load hoist brake, that regulates the lowering speed of the hoist mechanism. The crane carrier shall not travel at any time while a qualified arborist is attached.
- **5.7. 13.7** An accurate estimation of the **load radius** to be used during lifting shall be made before a qualified arborist is hoisted.

### **Z133 Definitions**

**arborist climbing line** (5.7.9): A line designated to support the climber while aloft in a tree or attached to a crane, constructed according to specifications outlined in subsection 8.1.8.

**arborist saddle** (5.7.9): An arrangement of straps, fittings, and buckles or other elements in the form of a waist belt with a low attachment element or elements and connecting support encircling the legs, suitably arranged to support the body in a sitting position.

blind pick (5.7.12): A work situation where the qualified arborist or the load is not in full view of the qualified crane operator.

qualified crane operator (5.7.3): An individual who:

o has demonstrated proficiency to operate the type and capacity of equipment he/she operates;

o is familiar with the equipment and hazards involved with arboriculture crane operations and has demonstrated proficiency in performing the special techniques involved;

o where applicable, meets federal, state, or local requirements for licensure or training.

shock-load (5.7.8): The force exerted by a falling or moving object on the structure supporting it, which is greater than the weight of the object. Also referred to as dynamic load.

signal person, designated (5.7.10): A qualified person assigned to monitor the crane operation and maintain appropriate communication with the qualified crane operator.

suspended (load) (5.7.7): Any attached load held off the ground and against the force of gravity by the crane.

## Crane Tie-In Methods



UNACCEPTABLE: Climbers must avoid placing climbing line or lanyard directly into the hook and certainly not in a hook that isn't latched and "locked".



ACCEPTABLE: shackle above the ball, pin wired in place, climbing line in friction-saver.





ACCEPTABLE: Climbing line run through master link. Crane hook is latched and wired shut. Various size slings remain in the hook.



ACCEPTABLE: Locking carabiner simultaneously captures the friction-saver and "locks" the shackle pin.

UNACCEPTABLE (opposite): Climbing line running over the un-locked pin on a shackle. The line could cause the pin to loosen and fall out.

ACCEPTABLE (not pictured): Tying directly into the crane boom, usually via a shackle.

## **Exceptions to the OSHA Rule**


Through letters of interpretation and permanent "variances", OSHA has allowed exceptions to the rule, "No hoisting workers with cranes."

Permanent variances have been granted at the request of various construction-related trades involving cranes apply very narrowly to specific employers whose workers are engaged in the construction or maintenance of tapered chimneys. More information on the variance process can be found at http://www.osha.gov/dts/otpca/variances

OSHA interpretations allowing the use of a man-basket on the crane load line apply fairly broadly to crane users. Obviously, the presence of a man-basket on the end of the crane's load line effectively turns that crane into a dedicated personnel hoisting device. In a tree work setting, this would necessitate a second crane on site for lifting tree sections. Very often, space limitations prevent the use of two cranes on one tree.

Our industry has attempted to use personnel lifting platforms or "man-cages" to enter trees under certain conditions, but at times the man-cage can actually place the tree worker in an extremely hazardous situation. Often, the lack of balance as well as the interference from the cables and metal structure while attempting to use a chain saw creates a situation that can jeopardize the lives of the workers. It is for these reasons that our industry's safety professionals developed procedures for tying into a crane above the becket (headache ball) or on a clevis near the jib or boom tip with an arborist saddle and climbing line meeting ANSI Z133 requirements.

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On May 13, 2022 at or about 0721 hours Yates County Deputy Sheriff McGuigan was dispatched to 2261 W. Lake Road, Penn Yan for the report of a male that had fallen 50-60 feet from a tree to the ground. At the time of dispatch the male was reported to be unconscious and the status of pulse and breathing was unknown. Also dispatched to the scene was Yates County OEM (Ryan Bailey), Branchport Fire Department (crew of 8 members, see attendance sheet), Penn Yan Ambulance (Joseph Houck and Samuel Beckley), and Medic 55 (David Dowdle).

Deputy McGuigan and Branchport FD Deputy Chief Oppel arrived on scene at 0727 hours and found the victim, later identified as Ryan James Rector (DOB 10/18/1994) to be on the north east side of 2689 W. Lake road, between a terraced earth embankment and ground mounted air conditioning units. He was laying on his back, slightly turned towards his right side, with visible blood in the oral and nasal airway passages as well as blood on the ground behind the rear of his head. Also observed was a large crane on the roadway extending towards the tree directly above the victim as well as a chainsaw, helmet, tree climbing spikes and assorted ropes and harness gear in the immediate area of the body.

Deputy McGuigan checked for a carotid pulse and observed it to be very weak and slow. Rector also displayed agonal breathing noted by sound and bubbling in the blood coming from his mouth. Deputy McGuigan cut his shirt and applied his agency AED prior to arrival of EMS as the victims pulse and

respiratory efforts stopped. The AED analyzed the rhythm and no shock was advised. At that time Deputy Chief Oppel began chest compressions. Once on scene Medic 55 connected Rector to their cardiac monitor and advised that he was in asystole, at which time they palpated his head and neck and found their to be significant internal injury.

Deputy McGuigan informed Yates County Dispatch to contact a coroner and have a member of CID respond to the scene. Lt. Nemitz, F/Sgt Ryan, Inv Rayburn and Coroner Dailey responded to the scene to assist with the investigation. Coroner Dailey determined the time of death to be 0815 hours. Coroner Dailey made arrangements with Perkins Funeral Home (Gorham) to transport the body to the Monroe County Medical Examiners Office for autopsy and toxicology investigation. Photographs taken by Dep McGuigan and F/Sgt Ryan were secured through Axon.

Basic interviews conducted at the scene revealed that Rector owns his own business, Hillside Logging and Tree Service, and was trimming / removing a tree at the above address along with Wilcox Crane Company. Persons at the scene at the time of the incident included (crane operator), Trevor Hanggi (Crane operator), (owner of 2661 W. Lake Rd / private landscaper) and (owner of 2689 W. Lake Rd / was inside residence when fall occurred). A was at the scene prior to the incident to aid the crew in set up before going to another job in Bristol.
Statements were secured from the crew members in which items of note included: That their was not anything out of the ordinary with the job, the job site or the crew members themselves that day. Ryan had donned his safety equipment at ground level and it appeared to be in working condition. Once lifted up with the crane he was talking through his head set with Trevor who was operating the crane. Trevor noted he observed him adjusting his rigging before he fell. In noted that he had seen Ryan go up the cable about 10 feet higher before hearing a metallic click and seeing him fall. Once the rigging and safety equipment could be gathered and inspected, stated that the only thing he could see that was abnormal was the fact that the safety lanyard was attached twice to the harness Ryan had been wearing. He stated that because it was hooked to him in twice, it would lead him to believe that he had not been using it at the time of the fall. Stated he also uses comparable gear as he has done some tree cutting as well.
Darryl Hanggi, Trevor's father and owner of Wilcox Crane Company arrived on scene with  They state they were Ryan's cousins and had already made next of kin notifications. The incident remains under investigation by the Yates County Sheriff's Office and Yates County Coroner's Office.

The Duty Officer, on Monday 5/16/22, received the message that on 5/13/22, at approximately 7 AM, an arborist had been hoisted by a crane, from Wilcox Crane Co., Inc., to trim a tree for his company and subsequently fell 50 to 60 feet to his death. The Duty Officer contacted the Sherriff's Department, researched for more information, advised the AAD and CSHO's were directed to investigate.

tree service provider, to look at a rotted tree that needed to be removed in his side yard. looked at the tree and told(b) (7)(C) it was too big of a job for him to do but he did know someone, Ryan Rector, that did larger tree removals. Ryan Rector was contacted to look at the tree. Ryan Rector determined due to the placement of the tree he would not be able to use his arial lift and would need to hire a crane for the pick. A formal contract was not written up for the project. The removal of the tree was scheduled for 5/13/2022. Early in the morning on Friday, 5/13/2022 at approximately 6:45 AM, near 2689 W. Lake Road, Crane operator/estimator for Wilcox Crane Co., Inc., began to set up the approved road closure while the crane was placed in position and set up for the project by lowered the ball to reaching distance from the ground prior to getting out of the operator's seat. The landing zone was in place. The pick was planned for 7AM. The tree that was going to be taken down was rotten and was estimated that it was going to take 4-5 picks using the zigzag method, similar to how a Chinese finger trap toy works, to complete the project. The arborist, Ryan Rector, needed to assess the tree and would be directing the process. Ryan Rector was particular on his safety gear and his set up. He was an experienced climber, Fire Chief, and had completed many rope rescues. Ryan Rector put on his headset, helmet, climbing gear, safety gear and attached his chainsaw to himself. Ryan Rector then attached himself to the crane, with a shackle to the line, so he could do a visual inspection of the tree from above. got into the operators chair to get ready for the lift. Ryan Rector communicated with to start hoisting him. Trevor Hanggi started hoisting Ryan Rector. Approximately 30 seconds into the lift, and at an estimated height of 50-60 feet above the ground, (b) (7)(C) saw Ryan Rector slightly adjusting himself in the harness straps, heard a metallic click sound, and saw Ryan Rector falling.

Ryan Rector landed on the ground, on the northeast side of 2689 W. Lake Road, between a terraced earth embankment and ground mounted air conditioning unit. Office owner of the house, stated he was inside his home, just on the other side of the wall near the air conditioning unit. He heard the thud and ran outside. Office sole proprietor of another tree service, was on site helping with the project and immediately ran down to Ryan Rector unhooked the climbing line from the saddle and took off one of Ryan Rector's spikes. Unhooked the climbing line from the gear. Emergency personnel arrived at the scene at 7:27 AM, provided aid and medical support. Ryan Rector succumbed to his injuries at 8:15 AM.  On Tuesday, 5/24/2022 CSHO's Trevisited the Yates County Sheriff's Office for additional information. At that time Ryan Rector's gear was obtained from evidence storage and was able to be inspected by the CSHO's. It was noted that nothing appeared wrong with the gear, and everything was intact. The only thing unusual was that the safety lanyard had been hooked back to itself. That had also been mentioned by After review of the facts, it appears Ryan Rector had not attached the safety lanyard and likely placed his shackle on the dead end of the Crane line. When he adjusted himself, his load shifted, bent the dead end over, and the shackle slipped over the end.



The certified individual, Trevor Hanggi, failed to notify the Commissioner of Labor of an unusual incident (fatality) before the close of the next business day as required by the reporting and recordkeeping requirements of 12 NYCRR § 61-3.7, which makes the reporting requirements of 12 NYCRR § 61-1.7 applicable to NY Certified Crane Operators.

According to 12 NYCRR § 61-1.7; Each individual who holds a Certificate of Competence issued under this part (61) shall report any unusual incident as herein defined. The report shall include the name and certificate number of the individual making the report, the name of the employer, contractor, owner, or entity employing or contracting for the services of such reporting individual, and a description of the unusual incident, including date, time, location and the nature of the personal injury or property damage, and in accordance with 12 NYCRR § 61-3.7, the report shall also include the name of the owner of the crane.

12 NYCRR § 61-1.2 (j) Defines an unusual incident as "any incident or event that results in personal injury requiring medical treatment beyond first aid, or in property damage in excess of \$1,000, or both, where such incident or event arises out of, or in the course of, performance of a certified occupation subject to the certification requirements of this Part."

Inspector's Observation: On May 20, 2022, I, Peter Turkow, was advised of a fatality that occurred on May 13, 2022, involving the operation of crane, owned by Wilcox Crane Co., Inc., that was used to hoist an individual approximately 50-60 feet into the air at 2661 West Lake Rd. Penn Yan, NY. On May 26, 2022, I interviewed certified crane operator, Trevor S. Hanggi, #19-0038. Mr. Hanggi stated that he was unaware that he needed to report this fatality (unusual incident) to the Commissioner of Labor.

Medical Examiners Office for autopsy and toxicology investigation. Photographs taken by Dep McGuigan and F/Sgt Ryan were secured through Axon.

Basic interviews conducted at the scene revealed that Rector owns his own business, Hillside Logging and Tree Service, and was trimming / removing a tree at the above address along with Wilcox Crane Company. Persons at the scene at the time of the incident included Samuel Bean (crane operator), Trevor Hanggi (Crane operator), Jeffrey Dennee (owner of 2661 W. Lake Rd / private landscaper) and Joseph Mathey (owner of 2689 W, Lake Rd / was inside residence when fall occurred). A Colin Rogers was at the scene prior to the incident to aid the crew in set up before going to another job in Bristol.

Statements were secured from the crew members in which items of note included: That their was not anything out of the ordinary with the job, the job site or the crew members themselves that day. Ryan had donned his safety equipment at ground level and it appeared to be in working condition. Once lifted up with the crane he was talking through his head set with Trevor who was operating the crane. Trevor noted he observed him adjusting his rigging before he fell. Jeffrey noted that he had seen Ryan go up the cable about 10 feet higher before hearing a metallic click and seeing him fall. At that time Trevor called 911 while Jeffrey and Samuel ran down to Ryan's Aid. They stated they removed his harness, helmet and climbing spike as he was tangled in ropes and wanted to get him to his side because he was choking on blood.

Once the rigging and safety equipment could be gathered and inspected, Jeffrey stated that the only thing he could see that was abnormal was the fact that the safety lanyard was attached twice to the harness Ryan had been wearing. He stated that because it was hooked to him in twice, it would lead him to believe that he had not been using it at the time of the fall. Jeffrey stated he also uses comparable gear as he has done some tree cutting as well.

Darryl Hanggi, Trevor's father and owner of Wilcox Crane Company arrived on scene with his daughter Lauren Hanggi. They state they were Ryan's cousins and had already made next of kin notifications. The incident remains under investigation by the Yates County Sheriff's Office and Yates County Coroner's Office.

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On 05/13/2022 at arond 07:47am IO responded to 2661 West Lake Road, Pann Yan NY, 14527 for a reported fatal accident involving a male falling 50-60 feet from a tree. IO photographed the scene with the OSCR 360 camera and took still photographs. Upon arrival the victim was near the base of the tree, slightly farther down hill, between a wooden retaining wall and an air conditioner unit. Victim was on his back. IO took a statement from Jeffrey Dennee. Jeffrey stated he heard a metallic click and then saw Ryan start to fall. Jeffrey ran down to help Ryan. Jeffrey turned Ryan off of his side onto his back to help him from choking on blood. Jeffrey also unhooked the climbing line from the saddle and took off one of Ryans spikes to allow first responders to provide aid to Ryan. Jeffrey looked over Ryans climbing gear with IO and no items were noted as damaged or missing. Jeffrey did see that Ryans safety lanyard was hooked to his belt twice, giving him the impression that it was not in use at the time of the fall.

IO also took a statement from Colin Rogers. Colin was the crane operator who drove the crane to the job site. Ryan left before the accident occurred but stated that when he left Ryan was working on his chain saw and had not put on his climbing gear yet.

IO collected Ryans climbing gear and the coroner turned over Ryans wallet to IO. Both were secured in evidence at YCSO.

IO contacted OSHA in Syracuse to notify them of the accident and left a message detailing the events that took place.

At this time it appears that Ryan was only attached to the crane with one point of contact. His safety lanyard did not appear to be in use. It is possible that Ryan went to unhook from the crane thinking his safety lanyard was attached properly and in use when it was not.
