

Finger Lakes Jobs



In April 2024, there were 485,300 private sector jobs and 578,700 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.

Job Gains




The region gained 10,600 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 6,700 private sector jobs and 3,900 government jobs.

Regional Industry Mix, April 2024





Over-the-Year Change in Jobs, April 2024






Unemployment Rate

All of the largest labor force areas in the Finger Lakes Region, except the city of Rochester, had unemployment rates at or below the State's unemployment rate in April 2024.

The State's unemployment rate (3.9%) exceeds the region's unemployment rate (3.7%) by 0.2 percentage points.

The unemployment rate in the Finger Lakes Region increased over the past year






Unemployment Rates (Not Seasonally Adjusted), 2014-2024

April Unemployment Rates, 2014 to 2024



Population by Race/Ethnicity, 2010 and 2020



Finger Lake's Diversity Index increased by 23% from 2010 to 2020


US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020



Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

A major \$50 million renovation project for the historic Genesee Brewery in Rochester (Monroe County) will transform the 146-year-old facility into a world-class packaging plant, increasing manufacturing capacity and efficiency, while creating up to 57 new jobs over the next two years and retaining over 500 existing workers. A key aspect of the project involves establishing the first U.S. production line for Labatt Blue and Labatt Blue Light beers to supplement Canadian production. New York State is supporting the modernization upgrades with a \$7 million capital grant to the brewery's parent company, FIFCO USA. (governor.ny.gov)

A groundbreaking ceremony for a new Fairlife production facility in Webster (Monroe County) was held in April. Once operational, the \$650 million investment by the dairy company will create over 250 new jobs in the region. The facility, which will span a massive 745,000 square feet and require 500 construction workers to complete, is expected to be operational sometime in 2025. Fairlife, a subsidiary of Coca-Cola, is known for its ultra-filtered milk and other dairy products. (rochesterfirst.com)

Catholic Charities Family and Community Services has received a grant for \$5.4 million over five years to bolster its Refugee Employment Services Program in Rochester (Monroe County). The funding from New York State's Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance will allow the organization to ramp up job preparation and placement services for newly arriving refugees. The program has successfully placed over 370 refugees in local jobs since 2019, with many achieving self-sufficiency within 90 days of employment. (rbj.net)

Nearly \$1.56 million in federal funding has been allocated to support workforce training programs and infrastructure upgrades in the Rochester (Monroe County) area. The appropriations include \$800,000 for the Ibero-American Action League to provide paid healthcare apprenticeships to underrepresented communities, \$259,000 for Monroe Community College to establish a new semiconductor technician training initiative and \$500,000 for SUNY Geneseo (Livingston County) to enhance its technology, safety and power infrastructure. Bad news

Xerox Corporation has announced plans to discontinue certain manufacturing activities at its Webster (Monroe County) facility. There are currently nearly 1,500 people employed at the Xerox Webster campus, though there's no indication what this latest announcement may do in terms of reducing that number. The workforce reduction in Webster relates to Xerox's January announcement that it would be targeting an overall 15% reduction in its global workforce. The change aligns with Xerox's strategy to streamline operations amid evolving industry conditions. (wxxinews.org)
