

Mohawk Valley Jobs

In April 2024, there were 141,300 private sector jobs and 183,500 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.

Four industry sectors make up 74% of total nonfarm jobs:

Job Gains


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The region gained 2,600 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 1,600 private sector jobs and 1,000 government jobs.

The region's most significant industry is Government Regional Industry Mix, April 2024






Unemployment Rate

Unemployment Rate (%)




The State's unemployment rate (3.9%) is less than the region's unemployment rate (4.1%) by -0.2 percentage points.

April Unemployment Rates, 2014 to 2024









Distribution of Population 25 years and over by Educational Attainment, 2022





Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

Mohawk Valley Empowers, a three-year initiative supported by a \$10 million Economic Development Grant, will be used to support students interested in manufacturing and technical careers. The program is a collaboration with nine colleges, BOCES schools and 22 non-profit organizations, all of which are located in close proximity to both the Wolfspeed 200 mm semiconductor fab in Marcy (Oneida County) and the future site of Micron Technologies, Inc. in Clay (Onondaga County). SUNY Poly, in Marcy, will also receive an additional \$4 million Empire State Development Grant that will be used to build a lab for semiconductor processing and packaging solutions and technology development.

The Central New York Association for the Blind, Indium Corporation of America, KrisTech Wire Company and Soldier On have been awarded grants and tax credits totaling \$7.6 million as part of Round XIII of the Regional Economic Development Councils Consolidated Funding awards.

Bad news

The Rome City School District's (Oneida County) budget proposal for the 2024-2025 school year includes cutting 19 elementary school teaching positions to fill a \$7 million deficit. The approved budget was presented to Rome residents for a vote on Tuesday, May 21.
