


Job Gains




The region gained 1,300 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 1,000 private sector jobs and 300 government jobs.

Private sector employment increased by 0.7% over the past year




Unemployment Rate

Utica had a higher unemployment rate than the State in October 2024.






The State's unemployment rate (4.1%) exceeds the region's unemployment rate (3.4%) by 0.7 percentage points.







Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

Wolfspeed, a semi-conductor chip manufacturer located in Marcy (Oneida County), has been awarded \$750 million through the CHIPS and Science Act. The grant money will be used to pay for the ongoing expansion of Wolfspeed's silicon carbide chip fab.

Hoshino Resorts, a leader in Japan's hospitality industry for over a century, will open its first new-build hotel in the United States in Sharon Springs (Schoharie County) by 2028. The 40-room resort will offer a traditional *ryokan* experience with minimalistic furnishings, set meals and the opportunity to soak in hot springs knows as *onsen*. Hoshino Resorts has more than 60 hotels worldwide.

Bad news

Bassett Healthcare Network, based in Otsego County, has eliminated 100 administrative positions networkwide. The layoffs were needed after two consecutive years of multi-million-dollar losses. No further layoffs are anticipated.
