


Job Gains




The region gained 2,500 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 2,000 private sector jobs and 500 government jobs.

The region's most significant industry is Government Regional Industry Mix, November 2024





Over-the-Year Change in Jobs, November 2024




Unemployment Rate

Unemployment Rate by Place, November 2024




Utica had a higher unemployment rate than the State in November 2024.





Distribution of Population 25 years and over by Educational Attainment, 2023





Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

Update: Construction on the \$370 million expansion of Turning Stone Resort Casino, located in Verona (Oneida County), has entered the latest phase of the project variously dubbed "The Next 30" or "Evolution." Regardless of name, the project will transform the resort into the largest convention destination in the state. The project includes construction of the 258-room Crescent Hotel, doubling the convention and parking spaces at Turning Stone, and new restaurants. The expansion is expected to be completed in 2027 and create 3,600 construction and related jobs, generate more than \$600 million in economic impact and provide \$22 million in state and local taxes revenue.

Wolfspeed, a semiconductor manufacturer with chip fabs in both Marcy, New York (Oneida County) and Durham, North Carolina has announced plans to close the Durham fab to simplify its business and accelerate development of its 200 mm chip fab in Marcy. The closure will allow Wolfspeed to solidify the capital structure of the Mohawk Valley fab with the aim of increasing annual revenue.

Bad news

The new Utica Children's Museum (Oneida County) opening has been extended into 2025, as construction delays have slowed the project. The museum will be the second in the country to incorporate the universal design concept that takes an accessible, inclusive and usable approach to ensure that people of all abilities and other factors are included and accommodated by the space.
