In April 2024, there were 106,700 private sector jobs and 153,100 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.




The region gained 2,600 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 2,000 private sector jobs and 600 government jobs.

The region's most significant industry is Government Regional Industry Mix, April 2024






Unemployment Rate





US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020







Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

Dick's Sporting Goods officials cut the ribbon on their new store in the Town Center Plaza in Watertown (Jefferson County). The Town Center storefront replaces a 20-year-old Dick's site formerly found at the Salmon Run Mall.

Jersey Mike's Subs, a sandwich chain headquartered in Manasquan, New Jersey, with about 2,500 locations throughout the U.S., opened its new location in Plattsburgh (Clinton County). The company has hired nearly 40 employees for the new shop.

Confluent Energies Inc. (CEI) plans to invest around \$60 million to build the first phase of a 10-acre hydroponic growing facility in Massena (St. Lawrence Country) to produce lettuce and other leafy green vegetables year-round. CEI has entered into a sales and marketing agreement with national fresh produce distributor D'Arrigo Brothers of California to deliver their product throughout the North Country region in New York State and other marketplaces on the East Coast. Construction is expected to begin in 2024.

A primary care health center is set to open in the summer of 2024 in Lake Placid (Essex County), pending approval from state and federal health agencies. The center operator, Hudson Headwaters Health Network (HHHN), will create six new jobs, with opportunities for more jobs by the end of 2024. The health center is currently recruiting physicians, internists, physician assistants and nurse practitioners.

Update: Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority's Board of Directors signed a deal with C&S Companies to provide engineering and design services for the 15,000-square-foot childcare facility in Ogdensburg (St. Lawrence County). The design phase of the \$4.7 million project is estimated to be completed by late fall of 2024, and the construction is anticipated to start in early spring 2025. When finished, the center will have 125 childcare slots, with 30 to 40 employees.

According to Advocate Drum's 2023 regional economic impact report, Fort Drum's contribution to the North Country region's economy has amounted to about \$2.5 billion. This level represents the highest in more than a decade and is a nearly 19% increase from the previous fiscal year. Advocate Drum states Fort Drum supported 24,238 jobs in 2023, nearly 21.4% of the region's wage earners in the region, making it the largest single-site employer in New York State.

Bad news

The Walgreens pharmacy in Potsdam (St. Lawrence County) closed in April 2024. Drugstores have been following suit amid the upward trend of brick-and-mortar store closings in recent years. Increased competition from Amazon and Walmart, as well as staffing shortages, are among some of the factors contributing to the closures, according to a January 2024 article from Forbes.com.
