

#### **North Country Jobs**



In February 2024, there were 106,400 private sector jobs and 153,500 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.



Four industry sectors make up 77% of total nonfarm jobs:

#### Job Gains




The region gained 2,300 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 1,900 private sector jobs and 400 government jobs.







US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020





Distribution of Population 25 years and over by Educational Attainment, 2022





## **Regional Labor Market Developments**

#### Good news

Charter bus company Hale Transportation plans to undergo a \$1.7 million construction project at its vehicle repair facility in Watertown (Jefferson County). The company will add 4,500 square feet to its existing structure and hire 12 new employees. The business will break ground in early spring 2024 and anticipates completion in fall 2024..

A new primary care practice is planned for Watertown (Jefferson County). According to the physicians opening the practice, the location will help fill the significant need for medical services in Watertown. Initially, the healthcare office plans to hire a nurse and a receptionist.

Cambria Hotel Lake Placid, the first new hotel in Lake Placid (Essex County) since 2013, opened its doors in January 2024. This \$35 million project was made possible in part thanks to \$3 million in New York State funding. The modern hotel features 185 guest rooms, a restaurant, event space and a waterfront gathering area, providing employment opportunities for over 50 full-time workers.

#### Bad news

United Helpers Assisted Living Program decided to permanently close its only assisted living facility in Canton (St. Lawrence County). The company issued a WARN notice for 33 affected employees to be laid off in April 2024. According to United Helpers management, low reimbursement rates, increased costs and staffing shortages are among the factors that went into the decision to close.
