

#### **Southern Tier Jobs**



In April 2024, there were 215,400 private sector jobs and 272,000 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.



Four industry sectors make up 72% of total nonfarm jobs:

#### Job Gains




The region gained 1,400 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including a gain of 2,000 government jobs and a loss of 600 private sector jobs.

Regional Industry Mix, April 2024





## **Unemployment Rate**





# The unemployment rate in the Southern Tier increased over the past year






### Unemployment Rates(Not Seasonally Adjusted), 2014-2024

## April Unemployment Rates, 2014 to 2024







US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020





### **Regional Labor Market Developments**

#### Good news

Aerospace, defense and transportation system manufacturer Lockheed Martin entered into a 10-year contract with the U.S. Navy to upgrade a digital receiver and legacy defense messaging systems. Work on the approximately \$88.4 million contract will be done at Lockheed's Owego (Tioga County) facility and is expected to continue through April 2034.

The Greater Binghamton Airport (Broome County) has received a \$3 million infusion of federal funds to offset the cost of a significant facility upgrade. The funding comes from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act Airport Terminal Program. This monetary windfall comes on the heels of a \$32 million award given in 2023 through New York State's Upstate Airport Economic Development and Revitalization Competition. Renovations started at the beginning of 2024 and are slated to be finished in 2025.

The Raymond Corporation in Greene (Chenango County) is expanding its business presence into Broome County. The leading global provider of electric forklifts and intralogistics solutions has purchased two buildings in Kirkwood which will provide added warehouse space and an area for limited forklift manufacturing. The company has experienced great success since joining Toyota Industry Corporation in 2000.
