

Southern Tier Jobs



In September 2024, there were 216,900 private sector jobs and 271,800 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.

Job Gains




The region gained 1,600 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 600 private sector jobs and 1,000 government jobs.

Regional Industry Mix, September 2024





Unemployment Rate





The unemployment rate in the Southern Tier decreased over the past year


Unemployment Rate by Place, September 2024





US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020





Distribution of Population 25 years and over by Educational Attainment, 2022





Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

New fiber optic infrastructure is planned across a great swath of the Southern Tier Region. The funding came from Empire State Development's ConnectALL Municipal Infrastructure Program which was designed to increase broadband access in rural areas of New York State. According to a Binghamton Press & Sun Bulletin media release, Corning-based nonprofit Southern Tier Network will use the \$18.2 million in grant funding to build more than 200 miles of fiber optic infrastructure across underserved parts of Steuben, Schuyler, Chemung, Tioga and Tompkins counties.

Binghamton University (BU) provided its annual construction project update detailing developments nearing completion and those on the horizon at its Vestal (Broome County) campus. The school's \$38.7 million renovation of the third floor of the Glen G. Bartle Library will be completed in January 2025. Aside from study areas of various sizes, the upgraded space will feature a digital scholarship center, a data studio and a maker lab. Looking forward, BU intends to construct a new \$60 million lecture hall, expand its east gymnasium by 75,000 square feet and wrap up its Science 3 and sports field house projects that are current underway.

Hospice care provider Mercy House of the Southern Tier held a groundbreaking ceremony at its Endicott (Broome County) location to mark a \$2 million expansion project. The added space will expand Mercy House's ability to assist families in comforting loved ones experiencing their final days.
