

Western New York Jobs




In January 2024, there were 528,400 private sector jobs and 642,800 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.



Four industry sectors make up 65% of total nonfarm jobs:

Government	114,400
Trade, Transportation & Utilities	112,800
Private Education & Health Services*	109,400
Professional & Business Services	80,100

Job Gains



The region gained 12,300 nonfarm jobs, including 8,500 private sector jobs and 3,800 government jobs, over the year.



10,300 of the recent job gains occurred in government, private education & health services, and leisure & hospitality.





The unemployment rate in the Western New York Region increased over the past year


Unemployment Rate by Place, January 2024

January Unemployment Rates, 2014 to 2024







US Census Bureau Diversity Index Scores, 2010 and 2020






