

## **NY SCION Project Summary**

The New York Systems Change and Inclusive Opportunities Network (NY SCION) initiative aims to enhance employment outcomes for individuals with disabilities aged 18 and older by leveraging existing programs and interventions. It focuses on expanding access to career services within the NYS Career Center network for job seekers with disabilities, fostering partnerships and collaboration across various programs, and ensuring the evaluation and sustainability of these efforts.

## Key Achievements Accomplished with Support of our Partners (March 2024):

- Established 404 active local partnerships.
- Developed 113 new partnerships through business engagement activities.
- Engaged 1,428 businesses in NY SCION activities.
- Served 2,364 NY SCION-eligible customers.
- Trained 592 customers with disabilities and 312 businesses.
- 11,185 individuals served through NYS Career Centers.
- 595 individuals entered training, with 399 completing it.
- 4,300 individuals entered unsubsidized employment.
