Program Development Resources – Return to Work

Return to Work (RTW) programs help workers go back to their jobs as soon as they can do so safely, after a job-related injury or illness. These programs change duties or make other adjustments to return a person to work promptly.

Use them to build a program to meet the needs of your business or group. Any program you create must meet the requirements of ICR 60 to qualify for an incentive credit.
