# The State's Economy

- New York's unemployment rate in May 2024 was 4.2%, which was above the year-ago level of 3.9%.
- New York's labor force fell by 17,100 (-0.2%) people over the year ending May 2024.
- The number of people employed decreased over the year and the number of people unemployed but actively looking for work rose over the year.

# New York's Nonfarm Jobs Are Rising

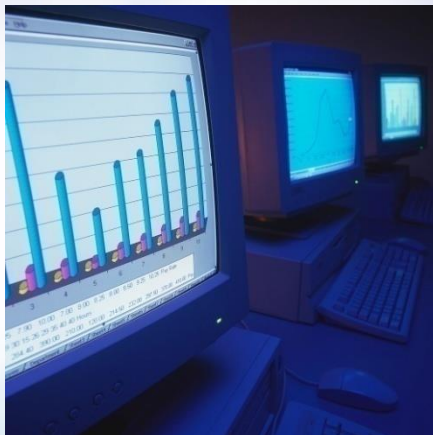
- Total nonfarm jobs rose by 167,700 or 1.7% between May 2023 and May 2024.
- The financial activities; professional & business services; private education & health services; leisure & hospitality; other services; and government sectors added jobs over the year.
- The natural resources, mining & construction; manufacturing; information; and trade, transportation & utilities sectors lost jobs over the year.

# Central New York's Economy:

- Total nonfarm jobs rose by 7,900 (or 2.5 percent) between May 2023 and May 2024 in the Syracuse metro area.
- May's unemployment rate of 3.8% was above the year-ago level of 3.2% in the Syracuse MSA.
- There are job opportunities in fields such as health care, engineering, computers/information technology, skilled trades, mechanical & repair, customer service, high-tech, scientific, R&D, construction, green-related jobs, transportation, warehousing & distribution, leisure & hospitality, accounting, and entry-level positions.
