

Mohawk Valley Jobs



In March 2024, there were 140,100 private sector jobs and 182,300 nonfarm (private + government) jobs in the region.



Four industry sectors make up 74% of total nonfarm jobs:

Job Gains




The region gained 2,600 nonfarm jobs over the past year, including 1,500 private sector jobs and 1,100 government jobs.

The region's most significant industry is Government Regional Industry Mix, March 2024






Unemployment Rate





Distribution of Population 25 years and over by Educational Attainment, 2022



Regional Labor Market Developments

Good news

The Air Force Research Lab in Rome (Oneida County), commonly known as Rome Labs, is slated to receive \$415 million from the federal government in fiscal year 2024. According to the Rome Sentinel, the funds were appropriated in smaller amounts of between \$1 million and \$25 million for 40 different areas at the laboratory, including photonic chips for quantum computing, a secure quantum computing facility, the internet of living things ecosystem, unmanned aircraft systems traffic management advanced air mobility enhancements, antenna development for secure communications, networks and B-52 agile pod capability. Rome Labs employs over 800 workers.

Mohawk Valley Community College's Advanced Institute for Manufacturing (AIM), located in Utica (Oneida County), will be one of four organizations working together to help small- to mid-sized manufacturers across New York State providing resources, expertise and grant funding in four key areas: cybersecurity, supply chain, advanced materials and Industry 4.0. AIM will be providing the cybersecurity component. Funding for the program will be provided by Empire State Development's Division of Science, Technology and Innovation, along with the National Institute Standards of Technology Manufacturing Extension Partnership.

Bad news

Bank of New York Mellon has issued a WARN notice regarding the closure of its back-office facility located in Oriskany (Oneida County), displacing 30 workers.
