



**Data Highlights from the

Seasonally Adjusted Current Employment by Industry Jobs Data

(Note: When comparing different months, seasonally adjusted data provide the most valid comparison; for example, May 2024 versus June 2024.)

- In June 2024, the number of seasonally adjusted private sector jobs in New York State increased by 6,900, or 0.1%, to 8,379,000. Over the same period, the number of nonfarm jobs in the state (private plus public sectors) increased by 13,200, or 0.1%, to 9,867,400.
- Industry sectors that added jobs in June 2024 were private education and health services (+11,900), government (+6,300), professional and business services (+3,400), financial activities (+2,300) and leisure and hospitality (+300).
- Industry sectors that lost jobs in June 2024 were construction (-4,400), information (-3,400), trade, transportation and utilities (-2,000), manufacturing (-1,000) and other services (-200).
- As of June 2024, New York State has recovered 102.4% of the 1,923,200 private sector jobs lost in the February-April 2020 national recession.

Not Seasonally Adjusted Current Employment by Industry Jobs Data

(Note: Not seasonally adjusted data are valuable in year-to-year comparisons of the same month; for example, June 2023 versus June 2024.)

- From June 2023 to June 2024, the number of private sector jobs in New York State increased by 108,600, or 1.3%. Nationally, the number of private sector jobs increased over the past year by 1.5%.

- Fourteen metro areas in New York State added private sector jobs in June 2023 – June 2024. The private sector job count grew by at least 1.4% in the following areas over the past year: Syracuse (+2.8%), Binghamton (+2.2%), Elmira (+2.1%), Albany-Schenectady-Troy (+1.7%), Rochester (+1.4%) and Utica-Rome (+1.4%).

Seasonally Adjusted Labor Force Data

(Note: When comparing different months, seasonally adjusted data provide the most valid comparison; for example, May 2024 versus June 2024.)

- In June 2024, New York State’s unemployment rate held steady at 4.2%. The comparable rate for the U.S. was 4.1% in June 2024.
- In addition, the number of unemployed New Yorkers decreased from 409,900 in May to 408,700 in June 2024. The statewide civilian labor force decreased by 3,000 to 9,720,500 in June 2024.
- New York City’s unemployment rate was unchanged at 4.8% in June 2024.
- The unemployment rate in the balance of state region (NYS-NYC) decreased from 3.8% in May to 3.7% in June 2024.
